NIGHT DRIVES

As gorgeous as any of our byways are by day, you'll get an entirely different perspective after the sun goes down. Traverse the North Shore Scenic Drive and marvel at the moon's reflection. Cruise across Skyline Parkway and you'll be rewarded by an array of colorful city lights, as well as illuminated bridges, including the Blatnik and the Aerial Lift.



NORTH SHORE SCENIC DRIVE

Dedicated as a Scenic Byway, the drive along the north shore of Lake Superior offers inspiring lake views. Along the way, you'll find lodging options from the quaint to the elaborate, taste-tempting restaurants and charming gift shops all along the drive. The North Shore Scenic Drive begins near Brighton Beach, which is located in Kitchi Gammi Park on Highway 61, and runs 22 miles to Two Harbors. 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HIGHWAY 61 (ALL-AMERICAN ROAD)

It's still here. Designated by the National Byway Center as one of the most beautiful drives in America, Highway 61 has been named an All-American Road. This breathtaking section of highway, which runs more than 154 miles from Duluth to the Canadian border, is the northernmost tip of one of America's most fabled thoroughfares.

Scenic Highway 61 is dotted with mom and pop shops and small towns, and winds through what is quite possibly the most amazing natural splendor you've ever seen.



SKYLINE PARKWAY

Our in-town scenic byway, this 25-mile drive boasts some of the best views of Duluth, Superior and the big lake. Rising 700 feet above the city, Skyline Parkway winds along the lake's prehistoric shoreline, towering over the St. Louis River, northwestern Wisconsin and downtown Duluth. Follow this natural cliffside terrace from I-35 at Spirit Mountain, around Enger Tower, over a dozen tumbling waterfalls, across Hawk Ridge and down the secluded boulevard known as Seven Bridges Road. Take an hour, or two, or three, and explore our famous Skyline—every inch of it is worth it.
